INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the Foundation Poland 2.0 Cookie Policy.

We use cookies to keep [our website](#) reliable, secure and personalised. When you accept cookies, this allows us to facilitate the use of our website and makes the experience better for you, for instance by remembering your preferences and keeping you signed in.

This Cookie Policy should be read alongside our Privacy Policy, which explains how we use personal information.

1. WHAT ARE COOKIES?

Cookies are small files that contain information about browsing activity. Whenever you visit a website, the website sends a cookie to the device you are using to access the website. Your device automatically stores the cookie in a file that is located within your web browser. When you revisit a site, the website will respond in a more personalised way.

2. WHAT TYPE OF COOKIES DO WE USE AND FOR WHAT PURPOSES?

We use different types of cookies for different purposes. They are grouped into the below categories:

(1) First-Party Cookies

First party cookies are stored directly by the website you are visiting. We use them for the following purposes:

- a) **Authentication**- Our website uses cookies to know whether you are logged in or not, and which account you are logged in with. In this way, your username and password are remembered, and you do not have to sign in each time you visit our domain.
- b) **Performance**- Cookies are used to monitor how often you visit our website and how you use it. Thanks to this information we can provide a high-quality experience, as we are able to quickly identify and fix any issues that arise. This data is anonymised and used only for statistical purposes.
- c) **Functionality**- Some of the cookies we use are essential to provide you with services you have requested. If you turn them off, some features of our website might not function properly.

(2) Third-Party Cookies



Third party cookies are those created by domains other than the one you are visiting at the time. Third parties may place their cookies on your device through our website to analyse when and how you use it. They may then use this information for instance to create personalised ad campaigns, sales statistics or for the purpose of user authentication. Thanks to these cookies, third parties will be able to enhance general user experience and user interface.

3. HOW TO MANAGE COOKIES?

You can set your browser not to accept cookies, or to alert when cookies are being sent. However, you should be aware that some of our website features may not function properly if the use of cookies is, in part or in whole, refused.
